***More about the facilitator:** Dr. Jacobson has been teaching college courses in the humanities for about 35 years, including programs for prison inmates in Connecticut and New York. He is also the current director and instructor for the Clemente Course in Holyoke, a college program in the humanities for low-income women, where he facilitates discussion on classic works of literature, art, history, and philosophy. Dr. Jacobson is also a documentary filmmaker and author of many essays and memoirs, including "A Reckoning," his story of surviving type 1 diabetes (in *Under the Sun*, Summer 2012).

Dr. Jacobson did his undergraduate work at Brown University in American literature and holds an M.A. in English literature from Indiana University and a Ph.D. in American studies (literature and film) from Yale University.

Dr. Engelman's work gets Published in Three Journals

Dr. Richard Engelman, chief, Cardiac Surgical Research, Baystate Medical Center, was the lead author of a team of six other authors in a new multidisciplinary clinical practice guideline on temperature management during cardiopulmonary bypass (CPB). These guidelines are the first to address surgical team management of a patient's body temperature during CPB. The guidelines were published in *Annals of Thoracic Surgery*, *Journal of Cardiothoracic and Vascular Anesthesia*, and the *Journal of ExtraCorporeal Technology*. Recently, Dr. Engelman and his son Daniel Engelman MD, surgical director, BMC, also published an article titled *Strategies and/or Devices to Minimize Stroke in Adult Cardiac Surgery*. This appeared last month in *Seminars in Thoracic and Cardiovascular Surgery* publication.
