MESSAGE FROM THE LIBRARIAN:





ANNOUNCING EBSCO’s Discovery Service tool

While the tab on the Health Sciences Library’s website that says “Journals & Books” links to our EBSCO A to Z list, EBSCO has also added a separate tool called EBSCO Discovery Service (EDS). This tool is accessible from the search box on the home page as shown in the EDS search box below:



EDS offers comprehensive, federated searching, using both Content and technology to deliver fast and streamlined search results from several databases all at once. The enhanced functionality of EDS combines intuitive search engine capabilities with high-end indexing for optimal results.
